Lyon County recognizes the needs and civil rights of all persons regardless of age, race, color, religion, sex, handicap, family status, or national origin. 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services) notice to persons with disabilities: members of the public who are disabled and require special assistance or accommodations at the meeting are requested to notify the Commissioners'/Manager's office in writing at 27 S. **Citizen Advisory Board Public Meeting Requirements**

Due to the concerns for public safety resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic and pursuant to the Governor of Nevada's Declaration of Emergency and Directives, the following requirements are in place for this Citizen Advisory Board Meeting: (1) all persons attending this meeting must maintain six feet of social distancing; (2) all meeting attendees are encouraged to wear a face mask; and, (3) the number of persons allowed to attend the meeting in person will depend on the meeting location and the maximum capacity of persons that can meet in compliance with the social distancing requirements, and, in no event, will more than fifty persons be allowed to attend the meeting in person. The public will be allowed in on a first come basis, until the limit is met as stated above.

Lyon County and the Citizen Advisory Boards strongly encourage all vulnerable persons to stay at home and not attend the meetings, but rather to submit comments via email or in writing. Vulnerable persons are defined in Directive 021, Section 5 as those who are at heightened risk of complications from COVID-19 disease, and include: (1) individuals who are 65 years of age and older; (2) individuals with chronic lung disease or moderate to severe asthma; (3) individuals who have serious heart conditions; (4) individuals who are immunocompromised; (5) pregnant women; or (6) individuals determined to be high risk by a licensed healthcare provider.

If any of these guidelines cannot be met, the meeting will be canceled.
