

The Honorable Board of Lyon County Commissioners met this day with the following present: Comm. Wes Henderson, Comm. Robert Jacobson, Comm. Dave Hockaday, Comm. Vida Keller, and Comm. Ken Gray. Also present: District Attorney Steve Rye, and County Manager Jeff Page.

1. Roll Call

4. Public Participation

George Robinson doesn't agree with the process of distribution of vaccines in Lyon County. The website and call number is not adequate. He stated he could not reach the Commissioners.

5. For Possible Action: Review and adoption of agenda

County Manager Jeff Page stated for item #15.a, Planning Consent, there was new backup received. It will not be heard as consent today. It will be reviewed.

Comm. Henderson moved to approve the agenda and to include the direction from County Manager Jeff Page. Comm. Gray seconded and the motion passed 5-0.

6. Time Certain

6.a. TIME CERTAIN AT 9:30 AM: For Possible Action: Discussion by each of the County Commissioners on their individual goals and priorities for Lyon County (Requested by County Manager Jeff Page)

County Manager Jeff Page asked the Board what they want to see accomplished.

Comm. Gray requested to finish the amendments to Title 15, the Dayton Valley Rodeo Event Center loop finished, a fire hydrant by the cemetery in Dayton placed, and to expedite the permitting process.

Comm. Henderson stated his desire is to attract businesses within delegated areas in Lyon County, amend chapter 5, to have meetings in other parts of the County. He wants to meet with the Department Heads and to gain knowledge of their services and challenges.

Comm. Jacobson requested to review and clean up Title 15. He commented he does try to answer his phone. He wants to modify the process of the COVID vaccines. He suggested the local residents of their cities to only be able to obtain a vaccine within that same location. He stated other concerns are the Dayton Valley Sewer Treatment Plant, Dayton Judicial Court, police protection, and the permitting process time frame. He asked for a meeting or workshop with the building community to discuss Title 15.

Comm. Hockaday's desire is to keep the community safe and to monitor the budget closely. He stated the COVID process is difficult with the many aspects to it, and communicating or educating about the process is a challenge. He agreed the Title 15 amendments should be reviewed.

Comm. Keller asked to review whether the building department inspectors can be Lyon County employed and not contracted out. She stated for manufactured homes, when applying foundations permits, they need a serial number when there is not one available for the modular home that have been ordered and not built. This creates delays for the permitting process. She agreed with Title 15 and to address the character districts. She stated there is a positive to pre-engineering projects, such as sewer, water, and roads. The purpose is to be ready to write and obtain grants.

Jeff Page stated he would like to be able to restrict the COVID vaccines and agreed with Comm. Jacobson that local residents only be able to obtain a vaccine within their same location. He will draft a resolution to be approved.

Comm. Gray commented that there was no mention of hiring extra staff and credits Jeff Page for the high functioning employees in place.

Comm. Hockaday asked for the Strategic Plan to be included on the list.
