Public Comments and Discussion

1. For Possible Action: Discussion and presentation of services from Jill Hemenway with the American Red Cross

Representative, Jill Hemenway with the American Red Cross, gave the board a presentation of services. She reviewed the value of preparedness for the community, businesses and households.

Josh Dailey with AT&T FirstNet gave a presentation of services for AT&T FirstNet. He described how First Responders utilize the system and the anticipation for growth with the cell service.

Patty Polish: They anticipate a busy Memorial weekend at Lake Lahonton and the State Parks are ready.

Shani Dues: Reported the labeling of the buildings is moving forward. At the Dayton School there was a lockdown yesterday. The District was pleased with how well the procedure went and there was no threat to the school. They are training and having presentations for the tourniquets that are to be placed at each school site.

Rob Loveberg: They have a new ambulance and are prepared for the fire season.

Rich Harvey: They have three new Captains and paramedic firefighters on staff. They have received a new ambulance and will be used after a radio is installed. CLF has a new training room that is open for meetings if needed. He gave a handout of the CLF Training Schedule and gave a report of upcoming events.

Lauren Staffen: She reviewed the bleed control kits locations and placements, school vaccines and the Resiliency Plan on May 28th. She gave a report of the CASPER program and the need for volunteers to gather the community assessments. She reviewed the Burn Surge and Mass Casualty Training, which it is free and offers credits. Also, the Access and Function Needs Support Training that is available.
