Public Comments and Discussion

No members of the public were present and no public comment was received.

1. For possible Action: Approval of April 9, 2020 LEPC minutes

Ryan Mcintosh moved to approve. Patty Polish seconded- vote carries unanimously.

2. For Discussion and Possible Action: Alternative ways to respond to hazmat incidents. (Requested by North Lyon County Fire Protection District, Kelli Cartwright)

Kelli Cartwright of North Lyon County Fire Protection District expressed her concerns with not being able to appropriately respond to hazardous material incidents. Due to lack of funding they cannot meet the quad-county requirements to sustain that relationship. Unable to afford the Triad’s cost to be part of their team.

If there was an incident the other teams can respond but North Lyon would be responsible for the cost which would more than likely be more than they could afford and still run day to day business. She is looking for alternative ways to deal with hazmat emergencies without bankrupting the department. Kelli asked County Manager, Jeff Page, if he knew how smaller jurisdictions such as Smith and Mason Valley deal with hazardous material incidents. Jeff said he could not speak to how Smith and Mason Valley respond. He stated, he believes they are both signatory to the Quad County Hazmat Team. He suggested partnering with Quad County hazmat if North Lyon is unable to fulfill those requirements there isn’t a lot Lyon County has no signatory authority with Quad County Hazmat.

Ryan Mcintosh suggested talking to Chief Rizer, to see if and North Lyon can combine staff to meet the quad county qualifications.

Kelli Cartwright asked about the role of the 92. Ryan McIntosh explained fact check and what they do and suggest North Lyon participate in a training coming up in August. It may be a good time to network.

Mr. Page suggested checking to see what City of Elko, City of Fallon and Churchill County have place for responding to Hazardous Material incidents.

3. Report from Lyon County Emergency Management. (No action)

Jeff Page, County Manager, said that Lyon County Emergency Management are dealing with two issues right now. The first being COVID-19 and making sure the appropriate Chief Officers, Dispatch, appropriate Law Enforcement Supervisors are being notified. Affected persons addresses are being fagged. Once they have recovered their addresses are then removed from the CAD.

The second issue is the numbers fire in Douglas County. There were concerns yesterday with it affecting Lyon County but has not as of yet.

Rob Loveberg said the threat has diminished. There was a slop over of about 30 acres last night. Resources were added but he does not see a significant threat at this time. There is a red flag warning for the fire this evening. They will be keeping an eye on it

4. LEPC member reports. (No action)

Chief Parrot reported things were stable in Mason Valley.

Chief McIntosh reported they are still navigating COVID and the impacts on their budget, staffing and operations. They recently had a Battalion Chief retire and longtime Captain go to work for Story County Fire.
